Are free solar panels a scam?

Know that "free" or "no cost" solar panel offers are scams. The federal government does not install solar systems in homes for free. If you're considering whether solar energy is right for you, check out the Department of Energy's guide for homeowners and learn more. Or check out the Department of Treasury's guidance on clean energy.

What is a solar energy scam?

The scams vary, but here's the gist: someone claiming to be with the government or your utility company promises big savings on your utility bills from solar energy or other home improvements designed to increase energy efficiency. If you agree to the scammer's offer, it could cost you tens of thousands of dollars.

Are solar loans a scam?

State investigations found unscrupulous solar lenders added a 10-30 percent fee to loans and increased monthly payments if consumers didn't turn over their tax savings to the lender. Report scams. Report energy scams to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center, IC3.gov.

Should solar companies be able to report a scam?

By getting more consumers to report scammy solar companies, government officials said, they can more effectively track complaints and seek to hold accountable companies that violate the law.

What if my company offers solar energy?

If your company offers solar energy, remember that claims must not only be truthful, but also comply with established consumer protection laws, including the FTC Act and the FTC's new Impersonation Rule. Be truthful. Every clean energy company has a responsibility to be honest and upfront with consumers. Be transparent about what you're offering.

Are solar panel Scams A Perfect Storm?

Fueled by a drop in solar panel costs, an urge to fight climate change, the availability of real but sometimes confusing government incentives and a desire to save on rising energy bills, solar panel scams are hitting consumers across the United States. "I think it's a perfect storm," says Minnesota Assistant Attorney General Noah Lewellen.

Be aware of solar energy scams - everything from scammers pretending to be affiliated with the government or utility company to businesses misrepresenting the cost of improvements, savings, and financing options.

Beware of solar companies engaging in deceptive practices, including the submittal of falsified contracts. Some unethical sales representatives may lead customers to believe they are receiving an estimate for solar, only to submit a ...
